Conquesta is an Olympiad open to schools in South Africa, Namibia, Botswana, Swaziland, Australia and New Zealand. It is hosted annually and is a lovely way for us to guage our school's performance nationally. We really encourage our senior students (Grade 5 - 7) to enrol to flex their brain muscles and give us, and you as parents, a good idea of our school's standard of education.

In 2014, our school came 4th out of all participating South African schools for Bible Education. Considering about 50% of independent schools in SA enter, as well as hundreds of government schools, this was no small achievement and we were so proud of the subject in which it was attained!

March is the time that we enrol again for Conquesta. The papers may be tough, but are multiple-choice in layout, and cover a broad range of subjects. The cost is R14 for general enrolment and R12 per subject. Subject material has been covered in class, so a healthy dose of courage and confidence is all that is required to enter. Children may enter as many subjects as they would like.

Here is a list of possible subjects:

Maths, English, Afrikaans (2<sup>nd</sup> language), LO, Creative arts, Science and Technology, Bible study, General Knowledge, EMS (Grade 7 only) and Technology (Grade 7 only).

If you or your child indicates that they are participating in Conquesta, for your convenience, we will automatically debit your school account for the funds.
