Hot coffee, hotdogs and tuck will be on sale for some extra sporty energy.

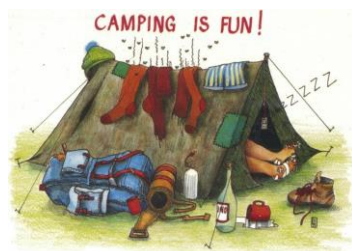
