#### Doing tech the "right" way...

As much as technology can be counterproductive to our children's healthy development, we are keenly backing this innovative programme introduced to us by Mrs Babcock:

#### FREE SCRATCH COMPUTER PROGRAMMING COURSE FOR ALL OF OUR PUPILS

A free web-based programming course in Scratch is currently being offered on-line through EdX (<a href="www.edx.org">www.edx.org</a>). Solid Foundations learners are invited to enrol in the course and complete it to earn an honour code certificate. Mickey Mouse pupils are welcome to

enrol too, but will need a grownup to "read" the course instructions with them. The great thing is that there is no cost involved and you have absolutely nothing to lose by giving it a shot!

Enrolment is open now (pupils are encouraged to enrol before the end of the week and to let Teacher Erika know if you have done so), and in order to earn the free certificate from completing this course, pupils will need to achieve a cumulative grade of 60% or higher by the time this course closes on October  $4^{th}$  - the end of this term.

Those who are interested must have access at home to a computer with internet, as the school computers will not be made available after school hours to participate.

To join, register at <a href="www.edx.org">www.edx.org</a> and enrol for "HarveyMuddX: C5002x Programming in Scratch" (www.edx.org/course/programming-scratch-harveymuddx-cs002x-0)

All of the programming in this course will be done using "Scratch," MIT's block-based programming language which is available for free at scratch.mit.edu

Note that Scratch will run in the following web browsers: Chrome 35 or later, Firefox 31 or later, and Internet Explorer 8 or later. In addition, you must have Adobe Flash Player 10.2 or later installed.

Solid Foundations learners who earn the honour code certificate will also get special recognition in a school assembly, a tuck voucher and may wear civvies on the first Friday of fourth school term, to recognize their efforts in taking an opportunity to better themselves by learning something new.

Why not get your child (or yourself) interested in programming in a kiddie-friendly way?! Who knows where it could lead and it's easier than you think!
