Grade 1 - 7 Parent's Meeting...

We are having a Grade 1-7 Parent's Meeting at school <u>NEXT WEEK SATURDAY</u> (21 January) at 8h00 sharp for Grade 1 - 3 and 9h00 sharp for Grade 4 -7. We do apologise for claiming your glorious Saturday morning sleep-in time, but we do find a morning meeting a safer option than an evening meeting, and more parents can attend if it's early.

Please note that attendance at the meetings is compulsory for our Grade 1-5 parents. The Grade 6 and 7 parents can attend with pleasure if they would like an opportunity to meet with some new staff.

If you are unable to make the meeting, send a family member or friend as a

representative please.


Children are welcome to play on the playgrounds - but they will not be supervised by staff during this time. With all of our teachers meeting at once, space is limited in the classrooms. If both parents are attending, bear with us regarding the limited seating available.

As per our reputation, we will be starting all meetings **SHARP!**

School uniform questions...

Just some clarification again on our uniform changes... Grade 1 - 7 pupils will be doing P.T. on one particular day during the week (they should find out today which of these days will be their "P.T. day"). On your child's "P.T. day", please make sure that they are wearing their P.T. uniform to school.

This uniform entails their house shirt (Eagles=red, Hawks=yellow, Falcons=blue) and black rugby shorts, with plain white or black takkies. If it's cooler, your child may wear their school tracksuit on a "P.T. day" or plain black tracksuit pants with the school jersey. School P.T. tracksuits are only available from Teacher Kathy at school for R410-R460 (size dependent).



The preschool pupils do not have a separate P.T. uniform. Their daily golf shirts bought at Boundary have all been embroidered with "Grade R". Sorry - we are taking this up with Boundary. For now, if your child is in Grade RR, we are fine with the "Grade R" embroidered shirts.

Our school does maintain a bare-foot policy from Grade RR to Grade 7 at our school. This means that the wearing of school shoes is <u>voluntary</u>. For neatness and safety, we would still like our Grade 1 - 7 pupils to <u>come</u> <u>to school wearing shoes</u> which they may take off during morning prayers. This is particularly helpful to Grade 1's who find their new school shoes guite restricting for their wriggly and busy toes.

COMPULSORY CLOTHING LABELLING!!

As you are not doubt aware, school clothes are expensive! Have you labelled everything? We are really on your side in this battle – but if clothing isn't labelled it will be donated to our school swop shop (116 Mooiriver Drive). It just makes our lives so much simpler if lost property has a name, so take a few minutes and mark, mark, mark!

What gate must I use?

We have got two main school gates - Korhaan Street and Maraboe Street. The gates will be opened at 7h00 for early parents each morning, but full staff supervision on the playgrounds only occurs at 7h30. The gate on Maraboe Street is used for DROP AND GO traffic ONLY! Please do not park here and walk your child in. You will irritate the other parents and teachers who cannot access their parking bays. Children dropped off in this area must please not walk through the teacher's parking bays, as this is a dangerous zone for pedestrians.



For your convenience we have appointed traffic guards at both gates. Please give them your co-operation and support to keep our pupils safe. You are welcome to park near the gate on Korhaan Street if you would like to walk your child in.

We would also like to remind you to respect the "no stopping" signs on the street opposite the school gates, and PLEASE don't allow your child to cross the street unassisted.

In the afternoons, only the Korhaan gate will be opened from 12h30 onwards. If you have to fetch your child between 12h30 and 13h30, please note that you will have to enter the school premises to find your child playing on the opposite playground to where you parked. Our senior pupils are still in class at this time, and we need the playground at Korhaan side to be quiet for this hour.

We know it takes a bit of getting used to, but it helps with the traffic flow and with the monitoring of the school gates for security. If you are planning to drop off or collect your child outside of normal school hours, please do so at the office.

It would also be great if you could kindly relay this information to your child's transport club/ taxi so that they know which gates to use.

Lastly, please be patient and schedule some extra time for dropping off and fetching your child in the first week. Many of our new parents are still learning the ropes, so traffic jams are inevitable. Smooth traffic flow is only to be expected within a week or two. Thank you.



Settling the budget...

We are so impressed with the number of parents who have settled their accounts for January. Thank you for your obvious demonstration of interest in your child's welfare and good education. Just a reminder that school fees are paid in advance, and the school fees for January are overdue. Unfortunately if you do not pay within the first week of a month an automatic R100 penalty is added to your account.

We have put the "Outings and Shows" fees, stationery fees and book fees (where required) for 2017 onto your account. This needs to be

settled by February.

Rest assured, we do work out our annual budget down to the last cent. The stationery and books are bought directly from publishers and wholesalers and will undoubtedly be cheaper than any store you frequent. For our new parents, we appreciate that the first month of the year is a financial shocker, but we have always tried to bundle all the expected expenses together to avoid knocking on your door again for the entire year!

PLEASE USE YOUR CHILD'S NAME AND SURNAME AS A REFERENCE e.g. Sandy Baker- Jan school fees. DO NOT USE THE EMAILED STATEMENT REFERENCE NUMBER/KDZ NUMBER. Our computer programme generates a random number that is irrelevant to your child, so tracing the reference numbers are a bit of a headache for us. Simply use your child's name please.

The school fees for 2017, may be paid over 11 or 12 months. The statements emailed to you are generated over a twelve month payment plan. We do have parents who would rather compress payments over 11 months and enjoy a more financially relaxing Christmas period. You may select either option:

We would like to remind our After Care pupils that a full plan must be accepted regardless of your child's attendance or non-attendance in December holidays. We do pay our After Care staff December salaries, so we do not accept permanent After Care resignations in November.

Important

Information

- Please don't allow your child to bring toys or technology devices to a normal school day. If you would like your child to have a cell phone or tablet at school, we would kindly ask that for security reasons your child hands it in at the office in the morning and collects it at the end of the school day. As teachers, we spend all our energy interacting with our children. Looking after their new Christmas presents too is a little more than we signed up for:
- The Mickey Mouse book-programme discussed at the 2016 Parent's Information Morning will only be launched in February. We spend two weeks settling our kiddies before we start with further responsibilities for them. You will be notified as soon as we begin.
- No child is allowed to have medicine in their school bag. If your child is sick, send the medicine directly to the office through an adult, with clear instructions on when and how you would like us to administer the medication. This policy is for the safety of all of our children. If your child has a contagious condition (e.g. lice, ring worm or chicken pox) they unfortunately have to remain at home until given the clear by a health-care professional.

- Please update your telephone number and email address with us as soon as it changes. It is very
 frightening for a child to experience an injury or feel sick and not be able to contact mom or dad.

- Our Mickey Mouse pupils will be divided into small maths groups for early morning instruction. Please insure that your child is at school by 7h45. Trust us, they do not like missing out on this special time with their teachers.
