IsiZulu excellence...

We are really excited about the Zulu programme currently being implemented at school. Zulu seems to have a few tricky twists and turns for non-Zulu speakers, and so we've taken the safe route by implementing a programme designed by Dr Buyiowa Mavis Mini, a linguist who specializes in isiZulu. The lessons are presented by Miss Mamapa who speaks isiZulu fluently and is assisted by our teachers Mrs Obbes and Mrs van Dijk. The Zulu we teach is "core" isiZulu and not "common" isiZulu which would account for differences like "udadewethu" and "usisi".



You might also notice that prefixes are missing from our core words e.g. "nye" (number 1) instead of "kunye". This is a deliberate omission as we are teaching the route of the words first before we introduce the prefixes e.g. "ku". Thank you for noticing all these little discrepancies and caring about your child's education! We appreciate your involvement!
