Enrolments for 2018...

In answer to your questions, you <u>do not</u> need to complete the Education Department's online registration process to enrol your child at our school. If your child is in Mickey Mouse (Grade RRR, RR and R), you <u>do get automatic entrance</u> into the next grade <u>providing your child passes the school readiness tests</u>, which will be administered next month.

We are testing all "outside" Grade R and 1 candidates on the 24th June. Please notify your friends and family members that if they would like to get into Solid Foundations they should enrol in Grade RR

and not wait until Grade R or 1. We have to turn away so many applicants in these two grades because we are simply too full and already have two of our own Grade RR classes moving to Grade R and subsequently 1. We usually only have a handful of Grade R and 1 vacancies open each year, and we are flooded with enormous amounts of applications for these few spaces.



We also <u>cannot guarantee</u> that if a sibling is in our school we will automatically accept your Grade R or 1 application. Every applicant is treated with absolute fairness and goes through the same selection process.

If you would like to enrol a family member or friend into Grade RR or even RRR, please complete an application form in the office or download one from our website. Grade RR and RRR applicants are accepted subject to an interview. We will conduct these interviews after the July holidays during school times.

Prevent disappointment and please, PLEASE spread the word.... Grade RR or RRR is the best grade to apply!!
