This programme will take place during school hours, whereby each pupil will be given introductory lessons to these two instruments for one term each year. Lessons will take place during art or P.T. classes. Teacher Christine Braun is an accomplished cellist and

violinist as well as the co-ordinator of the East Rand Youth Orchestra (ERYO) and is spear-heading this exciting project at our school.

The violin and cello lessons will only be "introductory". The idea is that pupils who display an affinity or desire to delve deeper into this fabulous world continue with cello and violin as an extra-mural. In this way, we are joining hands with the ERYO in exposing children to musical possibilities and growing the next generation of musicians in South Africa.

On the topic of extra murals...


