Parents' Meeting reminder...

We have a Grade 1-7 Parent's Meeting scheduled at school <u>NEXT WEEK SATURDAY</u> (19th January) at 8h00 sharp for Grade 1 - 3 and 9h00 sharp for Grade 4 -7. Attendance at this meeting is compulsory for our Grade 1-5 parents. The Grade 6 and 7 parents can attend voluntarily if they would like an opportunity to meet with the senior primary staff or have a "refresher talk". Budget blues...

Thank you to our prompt payers. Don't forget that school fees are paid ahead for 12 months and are <u>past due</u> for January. The "Outings and Shows" fees are due at the beginning of February together with February's school fees. Late payments do unfortunately pay penalties. Please DO NOT use the KDZ number on your invoice as a reference. Only ever use your child's name and surname for us.

That being said, we have a payment made this week with the reference of "stationery". Who does it belong to?

Brain food...

Did you know that our school has a healthy lunch policy? This means we will clamp down on chips, fizzy cool-drinks, sweets and cookies in your child's lunchbox. The exception to this rule is Friday lunch. On Fridays, you can spoil your children with a pre-weekend "less healthy" option.

We will also sell hotdogs (R10) and tuck on Fridays. Our tuck-shop selection is very limited and R10 for tuck should suffice. If you are looking for alternative treat ideas for Mondays to Thursdays, why not consider popcorn, muffins, rusks, nuts, cereal,

Extramural activities...

Most, but not all, of our extra-mural activities start in February. Their prices and days will be updated on the school website

Many of the extramural coaches have asked to pitch their particular extramural to the pupils during assemblies in January, so keep your ears and eyes open for the best option for your child for 2019. A reminder that payment collection and administration of extra murals is the responsibility of the private coaches and extra-mural teachers. Please always deal directly with them.



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Grade 5-7 extra bits...

Our Grade 5 - 7 pupils do need a homework diary, a calculator and maths set (compass, protractor etc.) and <u>a box of tissues for school</u>. The diary must be brought to every class and we would love your assistance in checking that your child is recording their homework and in helping them to plan ahead. We are fine with any type of diary, but you may want to consider purchasing something light-weight. In addition to the diary, we will be uploading homework daily on the D6 App. We also recommend that you invest in a good dictionary for home.

...and the extra bits for Mickey Mouse pupils...

We have a few extra requests for our little people in Mickey Mouse (Grade RRR to Grade R). Can all of our preschool children bring the following items to school:

- 1. A grown-up's t-shirt to use as an apron for painting. This must be packed in your child's bag <u>everyday</u>, as we can't guarantee which days will be the "painty" ones! Please wash the shirt whenever necessary during the year.
- 2. A sunhat. Our playgrounds are largely shaded, but certain parts get full sun, so let's protect those precious young skins.
- 3. A spare change of clothes daily (if your child is prone to little accidents).
- 4. A box of tissues during the course of the year. We go through hundreds in our war against runny noses!



Mickey Mouse reading programme and vocab programme...

We would just like to remind you of some facts that will help you to navigate your journey with us in 2019:

- Our school has regular cake sales as fund-raisers. The money generated through these sales is given to
 the hosting class to purchase luxury items for their classroom. Participation in these cake sales is
 completely voluntary, but is a great way to demonstrate support for your child's teacher! If your child's
 class is hosting, you are invited to bake or buy something delicious and send it to school but still send
 your child with pocket money to purchase goodies too!
- If it is your child's birthday and you would like to send something special to school for your child to celebrate, please could you send cup-cakes only. Party packs and fizzy juices are really impractical for us (and when last did you try to cut a round, creamy cake into 24 attractive slices?!!) Cupcakes are neat and fuss-free. Thanks for your understanding.
- Please don't allow your child to bring toys or technology devices to school. As teachers, we spend all our
 energy interacting with our children. Looking after their new Christmas presents too is a little more
 than we signed up for:
- No child is allowed to have medicine in their school bag. If your child is sick, send the medicine directly to the office through an adult, with clear instructions on when and how you would like us to administer the medication. This policy is for the safety of all of our children. If your child has a contagious condition (e.g. lice, ring worm or chicken pox) they unfortunately have to remain at home until given the "all clear" by a health-care professional.
- Please update your telephone number and email address with us as soon as it changes. It is very
 frightening for a child to experience an injury or feel sick and not be able to contact mom or dad.
- Our Mickey Mouse pupils will be divided into small maths groups for early morning instruction. Please
 ensure that your child is at school by 7h20. Trust us, they do not like missing out on this special time
 with their teachers.
