

If you used the D6 in 2020, this means you need to change your child's grade on the app for 2021. Parents' Meeting change...

We have been watching the progress of COVID very carefully and in the light of President Ramaphoza's address this week, have decided to CANCEL our live Parent's Meeting on Saturday the 23rd. The teachers will email the minutes of their prospective meetings to you personally. Please read through these minutes very carefully. The teachers will be available for private meetings before or after school (by appointment through the office) should you wish to meet with them face-to-face



Budget blues...

Thank you to our prompt payers. Don't forget that school fees are paid ahead for 12 months and are <u>past due</u> for January. The "Outings and Shows" fees are due at the beginning of February together with February's school fees. Late payers do unfortunately pay penalties. A reminder that you NOT use the KDZ number on your invoice as a reference. Only ever use your child's name and surname for us.

Brain food...

Did you know that our school has a healthy lunch policy? This means we frown on chips, fizzy cool-drinks, sweets and cookies in your child's lunchbox. The exception to this rule is Friday lunch. On Fridays, you can spoil your children with a pre-weekend "less healthy" option. We also strongly recommend water instead of juice in your child's bottle because it really helps with spills and keeps our playgrounds bee-free.

Cake sales and Tuck for 2021...

Unfortunately, due to ongoing COVID concerns, cake sales are cancelled for 2021. However, tuck will be back up and running on Fridays, as well as our hotdog sales. Hotdogs are now R15 each. To ensure the safety of our pupils, only items that are wrapped/sealed will be sold at tuck (a very limited selection) and tuck will be sold per class, separately, so no lining up or crowding. Teacher Kathy will also be selling ice-creams on Fridays to raise funds for school sports activities.

Extramural activities...

We have allowed extramurals who can maintain social distancing and general COVID safety to continue this year. Most, but not all, of our extramural activities start in February. Their prices and days will be updated on the school website (www.solidfoundationsprimary.com) this coming week.

All the extramural staff have been invited to the Parents Meeting on the 23rd of January, so you can enrol your child at this meeting and ask any questions you may have.

A reminder that payment collection and administration of extra murals is the responsibility of the private coaches and extramural teachers. Please always deal directly with them and do not make their payments into the school account.



Grade 5-7 extra bits...

Our Grade 5 - 7 pupils do need a homework diary, a calculator and a maths set (compass, protractor etc.). The diary must be brought to every class and we would love your assistance in checking that your child is recording their homework and in helping them to plan ahead. We are fine with any type of diary/notebook, but you may want to consider purchasing something light-weight. In addition to the diary, we will be uploading homework daily on the D6 App. We also recommend that you invest in a good dictionary (English and Afr/Eng) for home.

...and the extra bits for Mickey Mouse pupils...

We have a few extra requests for our little people in Mickey Mouse (Grade RRR to Grade R). Can all of our preschool children bring the following items to school:

- A grown-up's t-shirt to use as an apron for painting. This must be packed in your child's bag <u>everyday</u>, as we can't guarantee which days will be the "painty" ones! Please wash the shirt whenever necessary during the year.
- 2. A sunhat. Our playgrounds are largely shaded, but certain parts get full sun, so let's protect those precious young skins. Remind your child to pop on their hat at breaks please.
- 3. A spare change of clothes daily (especially if your child is prone to little accidents).
- 4. A box of tissues during the course of the year. We go through hundreds in our war against runny noses!



Mickey Mouse reading programme and vocab programme...

We will launch our preschool reading programme and vocab within two weeks. We would like our brave pre-schoolers to settle in before adding this extra responsibility. More info will follow in future emails.

Junk monster...

Our school has a cute little tradition... a little "junk monster" lives in the storeroom and loves to eat all your rubbish! Please will you help us feed him? Don't ever toss the following items again:

THE FOLLOWING SECTION IS FOR NEW PUPILS AND PARENTS ONLY:

We would just like to remind you of some facts that will help you to navigate your journey with us in 2021:

• If it is your child's birthday and you would like to send something special to school for your child to celebrate, please could you send cup-cakes
only. Party packs and fizzy juices are really impractical for us (and when last did you try to cut a round, creamy cake into 24 attractive slices?!!). We also dislike our inability to control the contents of party-packs, which can be quite hair-raising. Cupcakes are neat and fuss-free. Thanks for your understanding.



- Please <u>don't</u> allow your child to bring toys or technology devices to school. As teachers, we spend all our energy interacting with our children. Looking after their new Christmas presents too is a little more than we signed up for:
- Your child is <u>NOT</u> allowed to have medicine in their school bag. If your child is sick, send the medicine directly to the office through an adult, with clear instructions on when and how you would like us to administer the medication. This policy is for the safety of all of our children. In the current pandemic, we request that any child who is sick (coughing, runny nose, head-ache) remain at home until the symptoms clear. We will also respond to any non-pandemic related contagious condition (e.g. lice, ring worm or chicken pox). Your children will unfortunately have to remain at home until given the "all clear" by a health-care professional.
- Please update your telephone number and email address with us as soon as it changes. It is very
 frightening for a child to experience an injury or feel sick and not be able to contact mom or dad.
- Our Mickey Mouse pupils will be divided into small maths groups for early morning instruction. Please
 ensure that your child is at school by 7h20. Trust us, they do not like missing out on this special time
 with their teachers.
