School uniform inquiries...

We are getting a lot of questions regarding the changes to the uniforms. Hereby a visual breakdown to help (Grade 1-7):



Description of clothing

Coloured House Shirt
(Discontinued in 2023)



When may it be worn?


<u>ONLY</u> on your child's <u>PE day</u> (new uniform may be worn instead - optional, see below)

Grey PE shirt
Black KDA shorts - not
rugby shorts
(PE uniform available now
at Boundary but only
compulsory in 2023)



OPTIONAL ANY DAY of the week (including PE day) - not compulsory

MAY NOT BE WORN ON ASSEMBLY DAY (Grade 1-3 Mon. Grade 4-7 Thurs)







OPTIONAL ANY DAY of the week COMPULSORY ON ASSEMBLY DAY (Grade 1-3 Mon, Grade 4-7 Thurs)

MUST NOT BE WORN ON PE DAY (if PE day and assembly day are the same day, please pack in PE clothes for your child to change into during break)



Please do not:

- Mix the formal uniform and PE uniform (we will allow maroon jerseys <u>under</u> the PE jacket on cold days (but not worn on its own with the PE uniform).
- Wear a button-up shirt without a tie, button-ribbon or bow-tie

Getting tough...

As you no doubt understand, we take school seriously! Please be on time. Children who arrive after 7h20 ARE LATE! We regard this as rude behaviour towards our profession.

Our mini cricket team won their match against Maranatha this week. And the netball results in the matches against Shangri La include:


