Uniform check...

As we start experiencing the first shivers of autumn, please check your child's uniform to ensure that they look smart and in sync with our school policies. We do NOT have a date when we switch over from summer to winter uniforms. As we've always believed, children should be dressed appropriately for the weather!

Casual uniform



Can be worn any day except our formal assembly days



Black and white tracksuit (new stock should be coming in this week at the uniform suppliers)

Grey socks and black or white takkies

Grey school golf shirt with short or long sleeves (coloured house-shirts are being phased out and are permitted only until the end of year)

Maroon jerseys may be worn UNDER the tracksuit top, but not WITHOUT the tracksuit top

Maroon bomber jackets may be worn OVER the tracksuit top, but not WITHOUT the tracksuit top.

Formal uniform



Can be worn any day but MUST be worn on our formal assembly days



White button-up long-sleeved shirts (no logo required) with ribbon and bowtie (Gr 1-3) or tie (Gr 4-7)

or

White open-necked short sleeved shirts (logo required on pocket), no tie or ribbon required

Grey trousers

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Grey culottes with stockings (MUST be dark grey stockings supplied by Boundary or MS Uniform)

Formal uniforms may be worn with jerseys and bomber jackets

Our preschool (Grade RRR-R) pupils do not have white school shirts nor do they attend formal assemblies, so they can currently wear mixed formal and informal uniform as they please. This may change after our parental survey in September though.
