have been shown where this is). Seating for parents is on a first-come first-serve basis, so parents, please don't be late! Pupils may bring something to play with for the evening, to keep them busy backstage while they wait their turn to shine. Please NO valuable toys or electronic devices.

Dress code for pupils: Blue jeans and coloured t-shirts supplied by the school.

Your child will get their shirt from school before Friday. Please iron the shirt and do not allow your child to wear it until the night of the concert.

Teacher Estelle's class and Miss de Waal's class must please wear black school tracksuit pants instead of blue jeans for their specific items.

All pupils (except Miss de Waal's class) wear white, black or white-and-black takkies and white, black or grey socks.

Tickets are on sale in the office. Please note that each person (regardless of age) who occupies a seat is expected to pay R100. Children sitting on laps are exempt.
