## Clean and safe...

In the light of the cholera crisis in Gauteng, we have had our school borehole water tested by a reputable laboratory (Aquatico). The results have come back and our borehole water is perfectly clean and does not need any filtration for drinking and domestic use.

We would therefore like to switch from municipal water to the safer borehole water option in the new term.

We will continue having our borehole water tested every 6 months to ensure that it remains 100% drinkable and safe for our children.

If you do have any concerns about your child drinking borehole water, please send them with extra bottled water to school.

If any parent would like a breakdown of the full laboratory report from Aquatico we will email you a copy with pleasure.

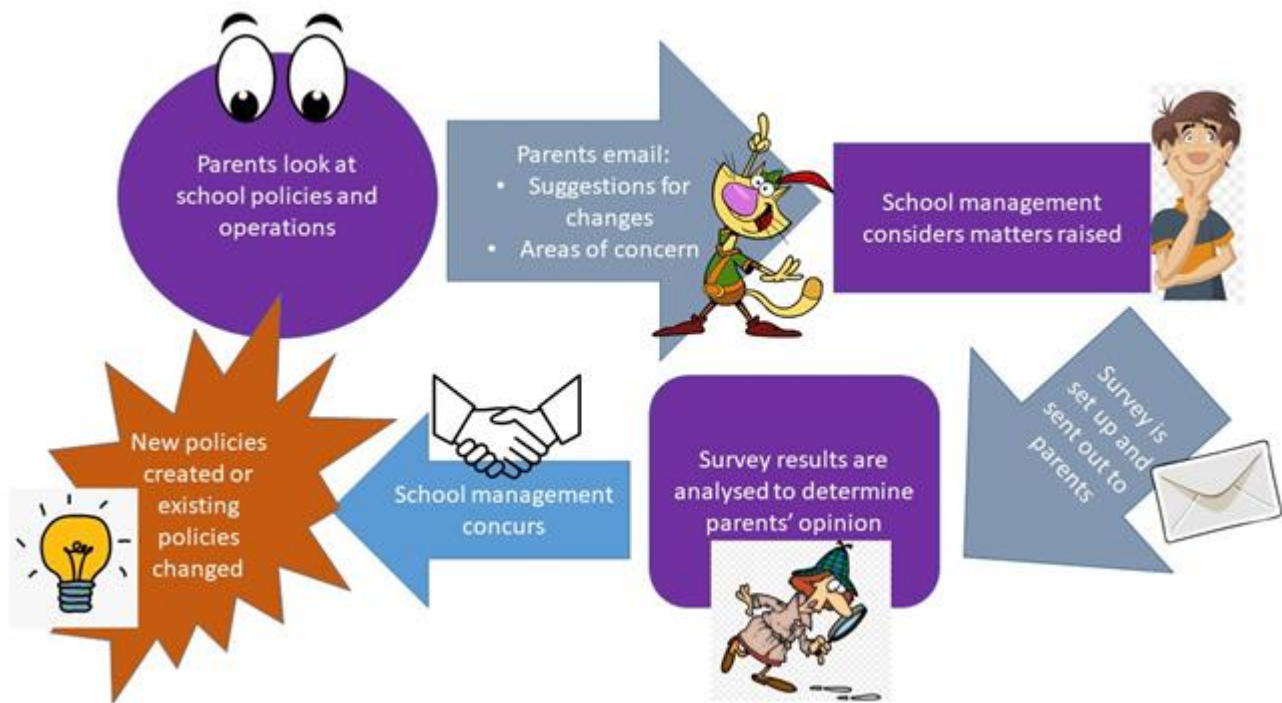
## Putting a pause on pizzas and bookbags...
