Going forward, a reminder that they are welcome to wear the following on Fridays (18 and 25 August, 1, 8 and 15 September):


- A green or "gold" or green and gold South African sports shirt. (Only green or yellow colours please.)

<u>Science fair reminder…</u>

Just a reminder that our Grade 5-7 pupils should be actively working towards their science fair projects. Remember that the judges are looking for scientific thinking... did your child have a hypothesis or question that was answered through their experiment or investigation. We are not looking for a demonstration project (e.g. blowing up a volcano), but rather a

project answering a question (e.g. What temperature makes the volcano blow quicker? How



many people prefer Colgate to Aquafresh? What can I do to make something bounce higher, dissolve quicker or wash better? etc).

Please ensure that your child's project is neatly presented on a <u>coloured stiff board background</u> (you should be prepping your boards by about now). We are looking for a <u>high standard of presentation</u> in which the projects are typed, graphed, photographed and neatly pasted on the presentation boards.

Some subheadings to use on your board to help you with your project:

- Research question, problem or hypothesis
- What I've read up/ researched about it (what has already been done or written)
- My method (include your design if you are making something)
- My findings (written and preferably in graph format too include corrections and retries if you made something)
- My conclusion
- Suggestions for further research I could do on the topic
- My references
- Photos of the process and result

Our school can help with printing (R5 per coloured A4 print), but please prepare in advance and do not send all the printing the week before.
