Preschool vocabulary programme...

Grade RRR-R... you are receiving a vocabulary card every week in your bookbag. These words will also be available on the D6 App on your phone (see resources > vocabulary programme).

Your child will be tested on these words every Friday.

HOWEVER, the vocabulary programme was never designed to be a "rote learning" programme. We have specifically selected a few "common" words mixed with a few difficult or unusual words, to





encourage you to TALK, TALK, TALK, TALK about them!!! We have sadly noticed that parents spend little-to-no quality time talking to their children. When last did you explain where ice-cream comes from, or why the moon is sometimes out during the day?

Please use the vocabulary card as a guide to discuss the pictures with your child. As you spend time talking about the pictures, you will find that your child picks up on the words quite easily.

Please remember that the MOST IMPORTANT YEARS OF EDUCATION are from birth to 6 years! Ten minutes a day at THIS age is like planting seeds of academic greatness in your child <u>for high school</u>. We will be discussing the words and themes at school too. This double-up system helps the concepts to stick.

You might have noticed that the words are repeated in Grade RR and R. This gives you an opportunity to build on your previous discussion and to re-cap.

If you commit to the reading and vocabulary programmes of our school, we guarantee a smarter child in years to come.
