### Grade 5-7 science fair bubbling up on the horizon...

A reminder that all of our senior primary pupils should be actively planning and working on their science fair projects. Please ensure that your child has the following:

1. An ORIGINAL idea.

We have discussed extensively with the children that just because something fizzes or pops does not

necessarily make it a good science fair project! <u>We are also penalising heavily for plagiarism</u> (copying an idea off the internet). We want to see children using the scientific process in their <u>own</u> thinking. <u>They can have a very basic idea</u>, but we want to see that the child has thought about a hypothesis and how to prove/ disprove it e.g. What is the most effective way for me to tie my shoelaces and how can I prove this?

- 2. Cardboard boxes or polystyrene sheets or wooden boards for their presentation (3 × A3 or bigger in size).
- 3. Paint or coloured paper to cover the presentation boards.
- 4. Information, pictures, photos and graphs <u>printed out</u> (no hand-written projects will be accepted). Please do not leave the printing for the week of the science fair.

If you are really in the dark about the science fair, please see your child's science teacher or Mrs Helmbold as soon as possible to get some direction.
