
It is so much fun to experience the sheer joy of little people taking part in all the bustling excitement. We look forward to seeing all our families there!

Survey results...

Thank you to every person who responded to our school survey. We had 132 families responding, which is a significant increase from last year. Here is a summary of the results:



Five areas of highest satisfaction for parents:

- 1. School cleanliness (98.5% satisfaction)
- 2. Classroom attractiveness (97% satisfaction)
- 3. Atmosphere in school (97,7% satisfaction)
- 4. Weekly newsletter (97,7% satisfaction)
- 5. Academic excellence (94.7% satisfaction)

Five areas of highest dissatisfaction for parents (areas to direct focus on in 2024/5):

- 1. Bathroom facilities (27,3% dissatisfaction)
- 2. Variety of extra-mural activities (12,1% dissatisfaction)
- 3. Area (size) available for children to play (10,6% dissatisfaction)
- 4. User-friendliness and satisfaction with D6 (9,8% dissatisfaction)
- 5. Homework and assignment expectation levels (6,8% dissatisfaction)







In addition to considering the overall results, we will also be looking at the individual clarifying comments made by parents.

To reassure two families that queried the stability of the access bridge (our "Troll Bridge")...although the bridge has a "spongey" feel when you walk over it, it is anchored and supported with massive concrete beams on either bank of the water channel. The "sponginess" results from the top layer being made from recycled plastic, which is exceptionally strong and more robust than wood. We hope this reassures you.
